Minutes of the Salhouse Parish Council meeting held on Monday 9th June 2025 at 7.00pm in the Jubilee Hall, Lower Street, Salhouse

For the benefit of the public, all votes taken were by a show of hands and/or a verbal response from each individual Councillor.

1. Chairs report

The Chair mentioned the large oak tree bow which fell on Thursday in Lower Street, and the Police priorities meeting scheduled for this week in Sprowston.

2. To receive and accept apologies for absence

Apologies of absence were received and accepted from Gary Browne (personal).

3. To receive Declarations of Interest in items on the agenda and applications for dispensations

None.

4. To approve the minutes of the Annual Parish Council meeting of 19th May 2025

The minutes were proposed to be approved, with no amendment, by Cllr. W. Browne and seconded by Cllr. N. Ball - all AGREED and signed by the Chair.

5. Public Participation and to receive District and County Councillor reports

District Councillor Martin Murrell reported on the DC receiving a local housing funding grant to purchase further temporary housing for the area; Rackheath medical centre now called 'MAGNA' and date for opening pushed back to Q4 due to utilities; the planning application for the pharmacy/dental/opticians for the site due to be decided this month. Current administration at DC means many things at a standstill. County/District Councillor Fran Whymark reported on the paper in public domain today reference the Local Government Reorganisation; NCC have done a lot of work and evidence shows best option is one unitary Council, which will save money. Also reported this week is carers week; NCC second cut of verges to start 16th June, with possible 3rd later in year; Mental Health Summit "Mindful Norfolk"; and agreed at cabinet meeting as from 1st July County Councillors will have a £5000 pot to spend on community groups /charities (up to £2500 match funded).

Chair asked if buses would go to new medical centre – Cllr Whymark responded certainly in the future – conversations happening.

A member of the public thanked the PC for the works at Shrubland Pond and their personal view that a Roadside Nature Reserve is not needed on The Loke.

The Churchwarden reported on a new contractor for grass cutting at the Church in the newer area and Community Payback working in the 'ancient' area. The current Vicar 's last service will be on 20th July 2025. The Churchwardens of the benefice will be working together during the period of interregnum.

A member of the Salhouse Station Group reported Greater Anglia have been working on the station building fixing facia's and drain work. The group has applied for a grant, and trying to involve Rackheath Parish as this will be an important asset to them as well. A member of the public asked if there were any plans to reduce the speed limit to 40mph on Honeycombe Road? Chair responded this is being considered later on the agenda.
