From the Editor

Dear Readers,

Welcome to the Spring 2025 issue of Salhouse Saga. It's been a long dreary winter, without even the distraction of a sustained spell of ice and snow to liven things up. The village seems to have been plagued by road closures, which are ongoing, these are in some cases for repairs and in some cases for new infrastructure. Whilst they are necessary, many seem to be badly managed with inadequate information about where, or when, closures are likely to take place. However, surely there must be some benefit for us?

The ubiquitous lime green barriers going up is a sign that 'City Fibre' are at work, bringing eventually a complete fibre optic network to every household. Some homes have already been connected, and on page 27 of this issue Steve Piper has kindly given us a brief overview of the work involved to connect his house. Thanks for being the guinea pig on this, Steve! However, there is no indication of how much this will cost and what the benefits might be, as it will be very dependent on what services, and from which supplier, you already have. There is some concern over how people who only ever use a conventional landline will be able to adapt to a broadband-based phone system.

On infrastructure of another kind, Konectbus have just announced their new timetable, effective 30th March, in which 'our' bus, the 5B, will have its route extended to the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital. This is good news indeed, however, there is a snag. Whilst the normal service is every hour, there is a gap in the timetable which means there is no bus from Salhouse to the hospital arriving between 07.44 and 10.44, which is rather inconvenient as this is when most morning appointments will be. But, on the positive side, the last bus home will be later, which will help City supporters getting home from an 8pm kickoff.

Finally, we understand that The Stag (or The Bell if you prefer) will be under new ownership by the time this magazine comes out, and we wish the new owners great success with their new venture.

From The Parish Council

A new year brings fresh challenges for the Parish with cold, wet weather, but hopefully Spring is on the way, and we should soon see the colourful flowers blossoming around the village. There are, however, still challenges for us all with rising prices, but even more so to the elderly especially with the loss to some of the winter fuel payments. For any residents struggling there is help available from our local charity 'Salhouse United Charities



Trust', they are there and can help financially and confidentially. See page 12 of this SAGA for if you are in need of help.

Footpaths: Salhouse is fortunate to have a great network of footpaths and footways in and around the Parish which are used not only by residents but regular visitors.

Footways along Norwich Road and Honeycombe Road have been high on the Parish Council's agenda for the past few years, and we have tried really hard to get these installed to benefit, and for the safety of, you the Parishioners.

Sadly, the Honeycombe Road trod path which had originally been approved by Highways, and had funding obtained, is unfortunately no longer being installed due to issues beyond our control.

The Parish Council have many times requested a path from the Mill Road mini roundabout to Station Road, and although a few years ago we were able to have some sections of path installed in front of the houses on Norwich Road, we have not been successful in gaining Highways support to install further along this stretch, although we will keep trying! Public support would be most helpful in our approaches to Highways and landowners.

Projects: You may have noticed in the last couple of weeks that **Bell Pond** has had some works carried out. It has been cleared of dead trees and scrub removed. This was part of the Parish Council's **Biodiversity project**, and by restoring the pond should allow more light and improve the water quality, which in turn should encourage more nature and wildlife conservation. Although it may take a while to see these benefits, they will come!



The Parish Council would like to pass on its **sincere thanks** to all who were involved, especially the contractors and residents who offered to collect and dispose of the scrub, without whose help the project would not have been a success.

Hopefully by the end of March we should have a new **bus shelter** installed on Thieves Lane. This was requested by many parishioners, and we applied for and were successful in receiving 50% funding from Norfolk County Council and some 'local member funding' from County Councillor Fran Whymark.

We have seen various **road closures** in the village. When the Parish Council is made aware of these we publish the details on our website and Facebook page to keep you all informed.

GT16, the **North Rackheath Development** (planning application 20220663), is still to submit its revised Masterplan to the District Council. Once this is in, everyone will have an opportunity to comment on the plans. Please remember, although this is named 'North Rackheath Development', over 650 dwellings will actually be in the Parish of Salhouse, along with open spaces and road closures, so will affect the whole Parish.

Within the village itself the Parish Council has received further concerns about car parking on Lower Street, Cheyney Avenue and Topcliffe Avenue, especially around school drop off and pick up times. These are on going problems which Highways and the Police are aware of, and the Parish Council is working with the school to try to help resolve the issues. The recreation ground car park is available to use by all, and there is a trod path running the length of the field inside the hedge boundary, which was installed so pedestrians don't have to walk in the road. It has a sign reminding children to take care crossing the road, then it's a short walk to the school via another path through Heron Close into Cheyney Avenue..

The **Annual Parish Meeting** is being held on **Wednesday 30th April 2025 at 7pm** in the Jubilee Hall. This is not a Parish Council meeting; the purpose of this meeting is to give the Parish Council and local clubs and organisations an opportunity to let residents know what they have been doing over the past year. The meeting is open to all electors and is an opportunity to have a say on anything they consider valuable to the people of the Parish.

Finally, I would like to give thanks to the **volunteers in the Community** who give up their time to help keep the village looking tidy, attractive, and safe — so thank you to Team Salhouse, Community Speedwatch and Defibrillator volunteers — your help and support is greatly appreciated!

In February this year we gained a new member onto the Parish Council when Ben Hazell was co-opted - we welcome Ben and thank him for volunteering to serve his community. Sadly, less than a week later we heard the sad news that our Vice Chair, Councillor David Francomb had suddenly passed away. Our thoughts and deepest condolences are with David's wife and family at this time. It was such a shock and a great loss to us all, he will be greatly missed.

County and District Councillors' Report

Fran Whymark and Martin Murrell

We were shocked to hear about the death of David Francomb, Salhouse Parish Councillor. We had only seen David the week before at Salhouse Parish Council, cheerful as ever. A great loss to the village, our thoughts are with his family and friends.

Rackheath Medical Centre is progressing well and should open this summer. Alongside GPs there will be several community services, promoting a 'left shift', moving greater resources and support into primary rather than secondary care. Next to the medical centre there are plans for a pharmacy, dentist, optician and consulting room. A real health hub for our communities. Hopefully plans will be approved soon and building can commence later this year. Pharmacy First is part of 'left shift', they can offer treatment for earache, infected insect bites, impetigo, shingles, sinusitis, sore throat, and urinary tract infections in women. A visit to the pharmacy could save you a visit to the GP. Go to https://improvinglivesnw.org.uk/the-pharmacy-first-service/.

Last month we told you about the English Devolution Bill. On 5th February the Deputy Prime Minister, Angela Rayner, announced that Norfolk and Suffolk would be a priority area for devolution and local government reorganisation (LGR). County elections this year have been postponed, with an election in May 2026 for the Norfolk and Suffolk Mayor. As you will have seen, in areas such as Manchester, the mayor has many powers to direct strategic planning, housing, transport, adult skills and employment, delivering local infrastructure for local people's needs. They will have a seat at the Council of the Nations and Regions, an opportunity to meet with government ministers and mayors from across the UK on a regular basis. There is a government consultation at:

https://consult.communities.gov.uk/lggc/norfolk-and-suffolk-devolution-consultation/ open for you to share your views, open until 13th April. What does this mean for you? On a day-to-day basis it will not change too much. Your bins will still be collected, and potholes will be filled, adult and children's social care will still be there for you.

LGR means there will no longer be County or District Councils, instead of thinking should I call Broadland District Council or Norfolk County Council (NCC), you will call your local Unitary Authority. The Unitary Authority footprint will likely be made up of several current district/city councils but this will be a decision of the Minister, not local elected representatives like us. We'll keep you updated.

NCC have more hazardous waste days at recycling centres for residents in April and May. Locally, Norwich North 2 & 3rd May; Caister 16th &17th May and Norwich South 23rd and 24th May. More information and how to book at https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/wasteandrecycling.

NCC offers Guidance for Older Drivers (GOLD). This helps drivers over 60 to refresh their driving skills, build confidence and keep driving for longer. GOLD has had very positive feedback over the last year, helping people with road positioning, navigating roundabouts, mirror and observation checks, speed awareness and judging speeds better. You can book a session with an Advanced Driving Instructor for just £39, with a full debrief and report at the end. For more information and to book your course: https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/article/39726/Guidance-for-older-drivers-GOLD or search GOLD on the NCC website. NCC will shortly be offering theory sessions too, which Fran is being signed up for, watch this space.

Although not a resident of Salhouse, Keith Holt, who passed away in December aged 92, will be remembered by many former pupils who attended Broadland High School in the 1970s and 80s as the popular woodwork and metalwork teacher. Several of them attended his funeral.

A man of many skills, less well known, perhaps, is that he also wrote poetry. The following poem was read by his granddaughter at his funeral, and is reproduced here with permission of Terry and the family:

COOL BROADLAND DAYS

By Keith Holt

Broadland's winter breezes blow so briskly, Licking faces stiff in fresh, whistling winds. Nature flights her keen arrows of cold kisses Through those boughs of twiggy, leaf-less trees, Cooling cheeks to glow bright cherry pink.

Breeze-danced patterns swirl the surface sheen Of Salhouse Broad set in its silent winter mode, Bounded by sentinel, soft rustling, waving reed. Web-footed birds swim the vast quiet expanse, Seeking a sparse morsel of winter season feed.

Winter holds a grip, cloaking all in mantle white, Bringing ice-locked frozen pools to silent calm, While bemused pens and waddling ducks slide Upon this glazed cold wintry ice, now set so firm. Oh, hasten warm summer winds your swift return.



Vaccination Update

We have been informed by NHS England that there will be another Covid vaccination campaign this Spring. We expect the vaccines to become available towards the end of March. We have not yet been told who will be eligible for the vaccines but please be assured that if you are eligible we will make contact with you.

Flu, Shingles, RSV and Pneumococcal Vaccines.

If you have been called for a flu vaccine but forgot to attend, we do still have some flu vaccines left which are suitable for older people. If we see from your record that you may be eligible then we will ask you to make an appointment. Flu vaccines for this season will no longer be available after stocks have run out at the practice or beyond the end of March 2025.

If you are eligible for any other vaccine you will be contacted and invited to make an appointment. If you were contacted a while ago but were unable to attend, it is not too late to make an appointment. Most vaccination clinics currently run on Wednesdays.

Volunteers needed

We are looking for help from volunteers. The reason for the help is to spare some time to show people how to access the NHS app and how to access online appointments via our website.

This would involve being trained by our reception manager then manning a desk in the waiting room to allow people to attend and learn to get set up.

If you are interested, please ask to speak with Joanne Burke our reception manager. (Tuesday to Friday)

Ordering drugs

Please remember you can order your repeat medications via the NHS app or online via the practice website or via Systmone online. This will save you visiting the practice to place an order for medications.

From the Rectory

Dear Friends,

On June 18, 1815, a watchman stood in the tower of Winchester Cathedral gazing anxiously out to sea. At last he saw what he was looking for - a ship sending a message to be relayed to the towns and villages in England. The watchman strained to see the message, as all of England held its breath, waiting to know the outcome of the war between their military general, Wellington, and the French ruler Napoleon – that ruthless dictator who ruled all of Europe except England, but still posed a threat to England; and now, the final, decisive Battle was being fought at Waterloo to settle the question of England's freedom once and for all. The Englishman in the watchtower received the news he had been waiting for; he began to relay the news across the bay via flags to the English people anxiously awaiting the outcome. As the watchman began signaling, a heavy fog rolled in and only two words got through: "Wellington Defeated". What everybody thought was bad news spread rapidly, causing gloom and sadness to come over the English people. However, the watchman continued to send his message and, when the fog finally lifted, the full and complete message got through, "Wellington Defeated Napoleon"! What a reversal! Talk about turning a negative into a positive!

Many of you will have received Easter Eggs at some point in your life, you may be looking forward to getting one this year, but I wonder how many of you have experienced what feels like the disappointment of an Easter egg?

You get given a box which is usually bigger than the egg, it's bright and colourful and you think great, then you open the box and take out the egg in its shiny wrapper, and you are full of expectation so you take off the wrapper and break open the egg expecting to find something inside it but nearly always it is empty, just a hollow egg. It's like an empty promise, you are full of expectation and then nothing and you feel a bit let down.

The good news is that Easter is about emptiness, the emptiness of the tomb, but instead of promises full of emptiness, in the death burial and resurrection of Christ, God gave us emptiness that is full of promise. The negativeness felt in the death of Jesus on the cross is turned into a positive by his resurrection from the tomb. The resurrection promises us new life, a new life that goes beyond our earthly life, a hope and joy not just for now but for eternity. Through the cross on Good Friday we can know God's love for us and through the resurrection on Easter Day we have the hope and joy of new and everlasting life.

Christ has died, Christ is Risen, Christ will come again, this is the promise of Easter, this is the promise of the Emptiness this is the negative turned into a

positive. So empty Easter eggs are not a disappointment they are a great reminder of what Easter is all about.

Jesus Christ is Risen, He is risen indeed Alleluia. Celebrate the emptiness this Easter.

Fibre Broadband installation has started in Salhouse.

Here are some pictures of the installation guys from City Fibre working to connect a property in Topcliffe Avenue on 13th February. The complete installation took around two hours.



The installers laid a straw (7mm plastic hollow pipe) from the pavement outside the property, through the garden wall and into a shallow ditch across the driveway ending at the property wall. It connects to the straw in the pavement laid several weeks ago.



The straw goes to a brown termination box fixed to the wall and a fibre is blown down the straw all the way back to the green roadside box in Cheyney Avenue.



From the brown box, another fibre is connected to an interface unit inside the property and from there a copper cable connects to the router. The broadband supplier (ISP) may provide a new router if the existing one is not compatible with high speed internet.



The system is switched on and, hey presto, it works!

The router is also used to connect the house telephone, if required.





Golden Daffodils are a welcome, heart-warming sight, marking the end of winter and the start of spring. They flower around Easter, reminding us about the renewal of life and the Resurrection. Also known as the Lent or Easter Lily, daffodils have been the national symbol of Wales, since the 19th Century and are often worn on St David's Day (1stMarch).

In the UK daffodils have other connections to the month of March, being the flower of that month and the astrological flower for Pisces.

The Language of Flowers has mixed interpretations of what daffodils mean. Alongside representing the first ray of spring, they can also represent vanity, hubris and misfortune, personified in Greek mythology by the tragic Narcissus, who captivated by his own image in a pool, wasted away and was turned into a daffodil. Botanically they are also called Narcissus and belong to the *Amaryllidaceae* family.

Daffodils have grown wild in the countryside since the sixteenth century and are

called a variety of names in different

counties;

'Nebbits' in Norfolk

'Butter-and-eggs' in Devon

'Trumpets' in Yorkshire

'Scrambled eggs' in Somerset

'Daffidowndilly' in Buckinghamshire and Cumberland

'Julians' on the Isle of Wight

'Lents' in Cornwall



Daffodils were the inspiration for William Wordsworth's poem 'I Wandered Lonely as a Cloud', one of the nation's favourites. Alongside poets, daffodils appealed to artists through the generations and more recently. During the Covid lockdown in 2020 artist David Hockney created a sketch on his iPad of a patch of daffodils with the title '<u>Do remember they can't cancel the spring</u>'.

As well as bringing hope and fresh beginnings the daffodil is also the symbol for cancer charities around the world, including Marie Curie in the UK.

Every year, this cheerful flower marks the passing of winter and heralds the future promise of summer.



'Waterwitch'

Very low tides at the end of February exposed the last rotting timbers of a wrecked boat on Salhouse Broad.

This is all that sadly remains of the 'Waterwitch', a once luxurious broads cruiser that served for many years as the playground of generations of Salhouse children.





Originally a 100ft Canadian-built wooden hulled 'submarine chaser', she survived the 1914-18 war and was sold off into civilian hands as a motor yacht. In the ownership of a Major Griffiths from London, who used the boat for holidays, she was renamed "Waterwitch". At this time the vessel was

said to be beautifully appointed with teak decks, a silver table service and even a grand piano in the saloon.

Waterwitch was moored in Salhouse Little Broad, but on the death of her owner was moved to Salhouse Broad where, at the start of the Second World War she

was commandeered and sunk to stop the enemy landing seaplanes on the water. Later she was pumped out and moved to Malthouse Broad, Ranworth, returning to Salhouse Broad at the end of the war.

By 1948-49 she became derelict and was moved to a position at the mouth of the Staithe where she remains. Presumably with the piano still inside, she became a



diving platform for youngsters, and remains in this location to the present day.



In the early 2000's the prow of the boat and sections of decking could still be seen. A large willow tree was growing through the fore-deck, but around 2012 a storm caused the tree to fall and demolish the bow of the boat, taking most of the visible remains under the water. The low tides of the past few weeks have allowed them to be exposed briefly.

If you want to imagine where the Waterwitch lies, sit at the bench on the newly refurbished boardwalk and look across the Staithe to where a clump of willow protrudes from the bank into the water. That's where the Waterwitch still lies.



EMERGENCY DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

In the event of a suspected heart attack / chest pains, the following procedure should be used:

- 1. Call 999 and ask for the Ambulance Service
- 2. Tell the Operator the telephone number from where you are calling, and they will tell you the location of the nearest Cabinet, as follows:



Jubilee Hall, Lower Street Salhouse NR13 6RE



The Green, Lower Street, Salhouse NR13 6RY



Station Road Salhouse NR13 6NX



The Recreation Ground Thieves Lane, Salhouse NR13 6RQ

- 3. The Operator will ask a series of questions which you need to answer to the best of your ability. This will only take a few seconds and will not delay the Ambulance.
- 4. THE OPERATOR WILL THEN PROVIDE YOU WITH THE ACCESS CODE TO OPEN THE CABINET
- 5. The Defibrillator and Resuscitation Pack should be removed from the cabinet and the Ambulance Service will stay on the line and give verbal assistance if required.
- 6. Switch on the Defibrillator and IT WILL GIVE YOU VERBAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE.
- 7. The Defibrillator cannot be used incorrectly as it will only deliver a shock to the patient if it detects it is necessary.
- 8. There are scissors in the Resuscitation Pack to assist with the removal of clothing and a pocket rescue breath mask to carry out CPR.

REMEMBER - Think SAFFTY

Before pushing the button, make sure everyone is clear and shout:

"STAND CLEAR - SHOCKING"

Speedwatch Seeks Volunteers



Norfolk Police aim to reduce accidents and deaths on our roads and in doing so, in conjunction with the Safety Camera Partnership, have empowered Community Speedwatch. This service enables villages to conduct formalised monitoring of vehicle speeds to maintain road safety.
