From The Parish Council

The **Annual Parish Meeting** held in April heard many reports from local groups on what they have done over the last year and plan for the year ahead.

It was sad to see **SalFest** cancelled at the weekend due to the weather, however we look forward to hearing the rearranged date for this community event.

The Parish Council has continued to meet monthly, however it does not meet again until Monday 9th September. Minutes from all the Parish Council meetings are available on the website www.salhousepc.info.

The Parish Council also has 2 vacancies – this is a challenging but rewarding volunteering role – please contact the Clerk if you would like any further information.

Date for your Diary –On **Friday** 4th **October 2024**, starting at 6.30pm in the Jubilee Hall, the PC is hosting with Community Heartbeat Trust a **Defibrillator Awareness Session**. Every resident in Salhouse is welcome to attend to find out more about these life saving devices. You can inform the Clerk in advance if you would like to attend, alternatively you are welcome to just turn up on the evening.

In the last couple of months a **new dog bin** has been installed on Howletts Loke and the Parish Council has received positive feedback on this asset. A new post has been installed for the reinstatement of the dog bin in the Church car park. The Parish Council invests monies to have these assets for use by all, however a polite reminder that dog owners are responsible for ensuring cleaning up dog fouling.

The Parish Council continues to collect traffic data from our **SAM2** devices around the village. Analysis of this data continues to show high volumes of speeding. The Parish Council works closely with the Police and Highways to investigate speed reduction solutions.

GT16 – North Rackheath Development –there is no update report for this edition of the SAGA as we are still waiting for the revised outline plan to be submitted by Taylor Wimpey.

The Parish Council is working on a **Biodiversity Policy** which will aim to conserve and enhance biodiversity in the Parish. Part of this will include improving Bell Pond which has become very overgrown and needs some TLC. Grants are being sought and we will be working with local landowners to get this project off the ground.

If you have any ideas or suggestions to help conserve and enhance biodiversity and conservation we would like to hear from you.

Neighbourhood Plan

Neighbourhood planning enables communities to play a much stronger role in the shaping of the area in which they live and work and in supporting new development proposals - this is because the Neighbourhood Plan forms part of the Development Plan and sits alongside the Local Plan prepared by Broadland and South Norfolk Council. Decisions on planning applications are made using both the Local Plan and the Neighbourhood Plan, together with any other material considerations.

Neighbourhood planning provides the opportunity for communities to set out a positive vision for how they want their community to develop in ways that meet identified local need and make sense to local people. They can put in place planning policies that will help deliver that vision or grant planning permission for the development they want to see.

The Parish Council would like to form a **neighbourhood plan review working group** to include members from the council and the wider community to carry out a detailed review of the existing plan. If you would like to be part of this working group please contact the Parish Clerk.

Back in April, a Public Space Protection Order was launched in collaboration with Broadland District Council, with the idea of allowing greater enforcement of vehicle anti-social behaviour by both parties.

Vehicle ASB, such as performing stunts, playing loud music, and using obscene language, can cause criminal damage, danger to other road users, as well as disruption and intimidation to residents in the area.

This PSPO now allows both the council and police to enforce behaviour in accordance

with conditions of the order, and taking part in vehicle ASB can lead to a fixed penalty or prosecution with a maximum fine of £1000.

We understand that there have been previous concerns of vehicle ASB at the Salhouse recreation ground, with unnecessarily large gatherings and doughnuts being performed. This PSPO will help to nip this behaviour in the bud, so long as it's called in while it's happening.



County and District Councillors' Report

Well, a week really is a long time in politics! As you will all know we now have a new Prime Minister and Government. In politics we all have different ideas about how we should approach issues (what is the most important?) but the overriding aim should always be making life better for all of us, I hope the next Parliament achieves this.

At Broadland District Council it would be true to say that not very much is happening. We continue to try to work with the leading groups and hope that this bears fruit (for all of us) over the coming months.

You will be pleased to know that the A47 safety improvements can now be completed. The Supreme Court has dismissed the application to appeal from Dr Boswell. Like you, we look forward to seeing work completed and driving along the dualled A47 soon.

Norfolk County Council (NCC) have submitted a planning application for the Norwich Western Link. Go to the NCC website and search for FUL/2024/0022. NCC in its role as the planning authority will now run a statutory public consultation to 18th July 2024.

At NCC we have a new Chairman, Cllr Stuart Dark. The Chairman's theme for this year is volunteering. Many of you are volunteers and have been for many years, often without even thinking about it. There are so many ways to get involved and help out in your community. Voluntary Norfolk run 'Get Involved', go to https://www.voluntarynorfolk.org.uk/ and follow the link to find out about opportunities that may interest you.

Finally, we really hope that the rain stops and we get a bit of sunshine in our lives. Like you we were disappointed that SalFest had to be cancelled. Let's all hope that the sun shines for the re-arranged event and it is a great success.

NEWS RELEASE—Work to start on new Rackheath 'Health Hub'

Construction company Darwin Group have announced that construction of the new 'modular build' medical centre on Broad Lane, Rackheath will commence on **Monday 5th August**. The buildings will be largely constructed off-site, and will arrive as 45 separate units totalling 1500m² floor space which will arrive by lorry and be craned into position. This operation will commence early October for about 7 days. The company have written to say they are putting in place comprehensive measures to reduce inconvenience to local residents. The new facility, to be shared by Salhouse residents, should be completed in Spring 2025.

The event was so popular we are aiming to hold another one later on in the year.

We have also just held our Salhouse Summer Social, and amazingly it didn't rain. We had Moores Madness entertaining the kids and lots of stalls, games, bouncy castle, gladiator dual, face painting, rounders, tug of war and lots more. We had an amazing turnout and raised a massive £2,224 for the school. With the money we are hoping to transform the school library. Salhouse churchyard is rare unimproved grassland going back 950 years to Norman times. Nowadays like many Norfolk churchyards it is home to rare wildflower species no longer common elsewhere. We are working with the Norfolk Wildlife Trust (NWT) to support these and the pollinators dependent on them.

Our goal: we still need to manage the churchyard, and so we want to cut and rake the churchyard once the wildflowers have bloomed and gone on **Saturday 3rd August** (subject to dry weather on the day).

- Please bring strimmers and rakes (we will have some hay rakes available)
- Please be mindful of safety when using equipment
- For safety reasons, we do not recommend bringing young children
- Bring a picnic and blanket free refreshments available in the church.

Did you know? The Church of England gives no money for church maintenance, and we have limited funds. We are very grateful therefore to Salhouse Parish Council for giving us a yearly donation which allows us to maintain the most recent and most visited part of the churchyard.



An occasional update from Hoveton & Wroxham Medical Centre

Autumn Flu and Covid Clinics

This year the practice intends contacting all eligible people for flu vaccine and covid vaccines during the late summer to invite them to book an appointment. They will be sent a link to book their vaccines directly.

There will be Saturday clinics and clinics during the week.

New RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) immunisation programme

This new programme of vaccinations will start this autumn for people aged 75-79 years and for people who are at least 28 weeks pregnant. Eligible people will be invited.

RSV is a common respiratory virus that can cause serious lung infections. The risk of complications are increased in older adults and in new and small babies.

Welcome to New Residents

This issue sees a small increase in the circulation of the SAGA, with two new residential developments each of four dwellings now nearing completion, at Hewetson Close and Potters Meadow. We extend a warm welcome to these new residents, and also to the residents of Wright's Meadow, off Howlett's Loke, which was completed in 2022.

How did these developments get their names? New street names in Salhouse are normally chosen by Broadland District Council, from a shortlist of suggestions from the Parish Council. There seems to be a tradition of allocating street names to persons of local historical significance or a connection to the site, although it is not permitted to use the names of persons still alive.

HEWETSON CLOSE

Hewetson Close is named after Captain Philip Hewetson, who was the only officer from WW1 named on Salhouse War Memorial. His father was Rev. William Hewetson, Vicar of Salhouse. Captain Hewetson fought in France and was first wounded in 1915. He returned to action and was wounded again in 1918, from which he later died. During his time in France, he wrote extensively to his parents about his experiences in the war; these letters survived and were considered so significant they are now preserved at the Norfolk Records Office, and are also available as a book.



Potters Meadow is named after Frank Potter, who owned the land and lived at the bungalow 'Meadow Hill'. Mr. Potter was the owner of Potter's Estate Agents in Norwich, at the junction of King Street and Prince of Wales Road. He was a well known character in Salhouse, and on his land, where the development is now, he kept a variety of animals, including horses, ponies, goats and rare-breed long-horned sheep. It is said that at one time he had some kind of big cat, possibly a puma. He also had peacocks, which could be heard all over the village. Mr and Mrs Potter moved from the village in the late 1990's, but sadly both passed away within a few years.



Wrights Meadow is named in memory of the site owner's grandfather, Jonathan Wright (1910—1989). Although there is no direct Salhouse connection, the QR code on the sign leads to the fascinating story of his early life growing up in Norwich in the early 20th century.



CLASSIC CARS IN SALHOUSE

Salhouse Equestrian Centre was once the location for a magazine photo shoot featuring a famous American model!!.

The model in question was a 1965 Ford Mustang. In 1994 this car, a pristine original example belonging to Max Floyd of Salhouse, and recently imported from California, was displayed on the 30th Anniversary Mustang Owners Club stand at the NEC, where it won the Best 64-66 Coupe award.



An auto journalist working for a classic car magazine spotted the model at the show and thought he could use it in an article which would compare the new 1994 version Mustang, just introduced by Ford Motor Company, to the iconic 'ponycar' which first appeared in 1964. The article needed some photos, hence the photo shoot. The Salhouse Equestrian Centre (now nos. 23/A/B/C Lower Street) was selected as the venue because Mustangs are horses, after all!

One grey day the journalist, wearing a Howard Hughes style western jacket, turned up in Salhouse with a brand new borrowed 1994 Ford Mustang and a professional photographer, and the shoot took place with the help of the groom and a horse supplied by the Centre. (see Page 37).

Photos were taken at the stables, together with 'high speed' mobile shots of the two cars side by side along Low Road between Thieves Lane and Primrose Corner. Unfortunately, the article was never published as promised. It was pulled for another story. But the Mustang still got its moment of fame, as it also attracted the interest of former Top Gear presenter Quentin Willson, who booked the car for a studio photo shoot for his coffee-table book "The Ultimate Classic Car Book", published by Dorling Kindersley, where it had a four-page spread.

Sadly, Max passed away in 2023, and the Mustang, which he maintained fastidiously for over 30 years, was sold to a new owner, who is hopefully now enjoying it in its 60th anniversary year.

For many years, classic car enthusiasts enjoyed the Salhouse Bell Car Club, which held monthly meetings, open to anyone interested in cars, old or unusual, at the pub. The club was very democratic; there was no chairman or committee. If you came up with an idea, you organized it. Salhouse Tree Steward



The weather so far this summer has been pretty lousy, however there is a silver lining to the clouds that have shaded our summer – the rain. The rain has given all of the newly planted trees and hedgerows essential water to grow and establish. Everything is still so lush and green. Although, it is time for more sunshine now, please.

Take a closer look at the next oak tree you see, many of the trees have stalks that bear promise of thousands of little acorns, this is called a 'mast year' which happens once every 2 or 3 years for oak trees.

The Salhouse Community Tree Nursery has about 500 trees and shrubs ready for planting out this winter from November time. If you would like a list of what we have available, please email me. The nursery trees have been grown with the generous help of volunteers and are free for local and nearby residents.

I am searching for tree and hedge planting schemes for this winter. This could be a dozen trees, hundreds of trees or hundreds of metres of hedgerow. Smaller schemes can have stock from the Salhouse Community Tree Nursery and for projects exceeding 25m of hedgerow or 125 trees, Broadland District Council are offering Landowner Tree Planting Grants for materials. If you are thinking about planting trees I would be happy to help advise on species, layouts, designs and applying for grant funding. Together we can make Salhouse a greener, more beautiful place to live.

I am so pleased to see the trees we have planted throughout the village and beyond grow, with most on the recreation ground now taller than me. Result.

Interesting Times Ahead



There is only one topic of conversation at the moment....

The election result

Well, wow the results are in and we have a new government, the most widely predicted result of recent elections.

For those working within the property sector and for anyone selling or buying, the crucial issue is how will this affect the UK property market?

Of course, any new government's policies can also influence the property market. We could see measures to increase housing supply (which could put downward pressure on prices) or help first-time buyers get onto the property ladder (which could boost demand).

So, what do we know so far? Angela Rayner takes the position of Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities as well as Deputy Prime Minister; Matthew Pennycook is Minister of State at the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities.

New Chancellor Rachel Reeves is likely to be focused on economic growth and outlined the urgent action to fix the planning system and steps to build the infrastructure needed. Her background interestingly includes having worked at the Bank of England and HBOS, she was educated at New College, Oxford and the LSE and a chess champion at the age of fourteen.

Having reviewed some of the key points within their manifesto, the new Government wants to build 1.5 million homes over the next five years and a new generation of new towns. The National Planning Policy Framework will be reformed with a consultation on a new growth-focused approach to the planning system before the end of the month, including restoring mandatory housing targets and the UK Government will create a new taskforce to accelerate stalled housing sites across the country.

Labour also wants to drive economic stability by keeping mortgage rates as low as possible, building capacity within HMRC, boosting their powers, and replacing the business rates tax system. It is also expected that they will review Universal Credit, increase the number of socially rented homes and support first-time buyers by introducing a permanent, comprehensive mortgage guarantee scheme.

Regulation of the private rented sector will be a focus and likely to be overhauled, improving building safety, and more protections for leaseholders. The Warm Homes Plan will create grants and loans for energy efficiency improvements in people's homes.

Certainly, affordability remains the biggest barrier for first-time buyers. The higher interest rates of recent years have introduced a new normal in terms of mortgage rates. Clearly the new Government must be careful not to risk the downward trend of inflation which, if maintained, will eventually lead to a drop in rates and subsequently a boost to the housing market.

At the time of writing this piece, we await the King's Speech, which will be on July 17th, to see what the focus will be on.

It remains to be seen how this will affect the local Norfolk property market, but hopefully in my next article I will be able to give you a clearer picture of how the first few months will have gone.



After a stroll around these typical manor house gardens and grounds we were able to see and feed some of the menagerie of animals. This was followed by superb refreshments which we could enjoy in the gardens or the house itself.



Our day trip was a double visit – first to Henstead Exotic Garden where we were given a guided tour by the owner and designer. Unlike many gardens that were made years ago, this garden was made from scratch some 10 years ago. This is hard to believe as the garden is quite voluptuous and the plants huge! At times we felt that we were in the middle of a jungle in the Far East! Coffee, tea and cake completed the visit.

We then moved on to Somerleyton Hall Garden. The centrepiece of the gardens at the west front of the house is the Nesfield Parterre, where the great equatorial sundial is encircled by the signs of the zodiac.

The charming sunken white garden to the north of the hall is set within the footprint of the former winter garden, a small part of which survives. This garden is a haven for bees and butterflies and must be a wonderful setting for the wedding photos taken there.

In the former walled kitchen garden there are flower, shrub, hosta, tree fern and herbaceous borders providing colour throughout the seasons.

There is a beautiful rose garden, currently being renovated and overseen by Lady Somerleyton. These rose beds have been planted up with Old English roses. Arches and obelisks complete the garden creating an area full of colour and scent throughout the summer months.

The maze was planted back in 1846 and is one of the finest yew hedge mazes in Britain. It took a little time to get to the centre and out again but, fortunately, we did not lose any of our members!

It was a splendid day out and despite the awful weather leading up to the day, we were blessed with sunshine and no rain!

Our final trip this Summer is an evening visit in July to the garden of Brick Kiln House at Shotesham. This is a two-acre country garden with a large terrace, lawns, colourful herbaceous borders and a contemporary designed pergola garden.

In August we return to meetings at Woodbastwick Village Hall with a talk by Rosie Ward about a year in a market garden.



EMERGENCY DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

In the event of a suspected heart attack / chest pains, the following procedure should be used:

- 1. Call 999 and ask for the Ambulance Service
- 2. Tell the Operator the telephone number from where you are calling, and they will tell you the location of the nearest Cabinet, as follows:



Jubilee Hall, Lower Street Salhouse NR13 6RE



The Green, Lower Street, Salhouse NR13 6RY



Station Road Salhouse NR13 6NX



The Recreation Ground Thieves Lane, Salhouse NR13 6RQ

- 3. The Operator will ask a series of questions which you need to answer to the best of your ability. This will only take a few seconds and will not delay the Ambulance.
- 4. THE OPERATOR WILL THEN PROVIDE YOU WITH THE ACCESS CODE TO OPEN THE CABINET
- 5. The Defibrillator and Resuscitation Pack should be removed from the cabinet and the Ambulance Service will stay on the line and give verbal assistance if required.
- 6. Switch on the Defibrillator and IT WILL GIVE YOU VERBAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE.
- 7. The Defibrillator cannot be used incorrectly as it will only deliver a shock to the patient if it detects it is necessary.
- 8. There are scissors in the Resuscitation Pack to assist with the removal of clothing and a pocket rescue breath mask to carry out CPR.

REMEMBER – Think SAFETY

Before pushing the button, make sure everyone is clear and shout:

"STAND CLEAR - SHOCKING"



Speedwatch Seeks Volunteers

Norfolk Police aim to reduce accidents and deaths on our roads and in doing so, in conjunction with the Safety Camera Partnership, have empowered Community Speedwatch. This service enables villages to conduct formalised monitoring of vehicle speeds to maintain road safety.

Salhouse has participated in this service since 2008 by conducting observations at approved locations within the parish. This is based on a group of trained volunteers observing traffic at random times to monitor traffic speeds and record those over prescribed limits.
